To support continued engagement through TSNS, the **Project Coordinator- Community Network Ambassador** will work as the team lead for the program to support the activities of Community Network Ambassadors across 9 community networks within the City of Toronto. The ideal candidate for this position possesses **post-secondary education in a relevant field** such as social science, community development, social work, or public administration, or equivalent experience. **With a minimum of two years of experience**, you have a proven track record in neighbourhood-level planning, implementing community engagement models, and working with diverse groups. Proficient in Microsoft 360 and various computer systems, you excel in tasks such as spreadsheet management, presentations, and email communication.

## **DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Implement the TSNS Community Network Ambassador Program.
- Form action plans for a phased implementation plan, structure, and monitoring and evaluation plan in collaboration with partner organizations.
- Collaborate with partner organizations to recruit, train, manage, and guide Community Ambassadors.
- Liaise with partner organizations, community leaders and City of Toronto staff.
- Support the ongoing supervision of Community Ambassadors who will support neighbourhood-planning tables, and community engagement and facilitate community meetings.

- Act as the point of contact for community partners, the city of Toronto, and Network Ambassadors, providing information, and support on processes, policies and ongoing impact of service delivery.
- Attending regular training and meetings with City Staff and partner organizations.
- Host, facilitate, and prepare for regular meetings with project partners and network ambassadors.
- Determine tracking methods for collecting data and ensuring work plans for Community Network Ambassadors.
- Develop a monitoring plan outlining data collection, both quantitative and qualitative
- Handles program equipment and organizes equipment/supplies regularly
